14 countries, 115M people, 12 languages, 2800 km river, 3000 vessels, 300 birds species, 90 fish species, 1M cruising tourists, ...











Rationale for cooperation in innovation policies: Improving the framework conditions for innovation, e.g.

- Attract and retain brains
- Scale: Joint use of research infrastructure
- Cluster/ Competitiveness mapping
- Innovation to the market: Technology transfer









EU Macro-regional strategies

- Initiative by the countries, Commission is facilitating
- Development of a Strategy identifying challenges and potentials Action
 Plan
- Endorsement by European Council highest political support
- Thematic priorities: Priority Areas, Pillars, Horizontal Actions
- Governance structure for implementation:
 - Political leadership: Ministerial level, Commission
 - Coordination: National Coordinators, Commission
 - Implementation: Thematic Coordinators, transnational cooperation programmes
- Not a funding programme! uses existing funding sources already available
















EU Strategy for the Adriatic Ionian Region

- Requested by the European Council of December 2012
- 8 countries (Member states: HR, EL, IT, SI; Candidate and potential candidate countries: AL, RS, BIH, ME)
- Strategy to be adopted in June 2014, then handed over to Council + other EU institutions); GAC on 24 June
- 4 pillars :
 - Blue Growth
 - Connecting the Region (transport and energy networks)
 - Environmental quality
 - Sustainable Tourism

EU Macro-regional strategies: Pioneering in coordinating funding instruments

European Structural and Investment Funds

- 2014-2020 new period: Investment arm of EU policies
- Overall EU 28, full period: EUR 351bn
- 2 goals
 - Investments in Growth and Jobs
 - Cooperation
- Shared management -> Managing Authorities in Member States
- Strategic Framework: Cooperation approach and EU Macro-regional Strategies included in
 - Partnership Agreements
 - All relevant Operational Programmes
- Transnational Cooperation Programme: providing support to macro-regional strategies



Transnational Cooperation programmes



Interreg Europe Programme

- INTERREG EUROPE: cooperation across all borders: EU 28+NOR+CH
- Policy learning to improve the performance of policies
- Budget of EUR 360M for 2014-2020; possible approval: end 2014 (?), first call spring 2015 (?)
- Public authorities and institutions under public law
- 4 topics
 - Research, technological development and innovation
 - Competitiveness of SME
 - Low carbon economy
 - Environment and resource efficiency
- Two types of actions
 - <u>Cooperation projects</u>: public authorities, policy exchange on a particular policy issue, develop an Action Plan
 -> ensure follow up
 - Policy learning platforms: continuous learning, for ESIF stakeholders; service provider and platform to consolidate knowledge, guides, transfers knowledge, ...









European Grouping for Territorial Cooperation (EGTC)

- EGTC is an innovative solution to facilitate and promote territorial cooperation
- Legal entity: enables authorities from different member states, to set up cooperation groupings with a legal personality
- Possibility of involving different institutional levels in a single cooperative structure (multilevel governance)
- 46 EGTC already founded
- New regulation:
 - Improvement of procedures and requirements for establishment
 - Content of the Convention and the Statutes
 - Purpose: Extension of scope and tasks Financial support other than EU Cohesion policy
 - Membership Third neighbouring countries and OCTs
 - Applicable law for employment
 - Manage and define terms and conditions for the use of public infrastructure or a service of general economic interest.
