What is the ERC?

ERC is a new type of funding body in Europe to support excellence in future research open, individual-team designed competition

egislation

- A Scientific Council with 22 members
- Support by the ERC Executive Agency
- A significant budget (1.1 billion €/year)
- Excellence is the only valid criterion

strategy

- Support for the individual scientist no networks!
- International peer-review
- No predetermined subjects (bottom-up)
- Support of frontier research in all fields of science and humanities







The ERC paradigm



- A radical shift in policy: pan-European competition to advance excellent ideas of individuals
- Support for excellent individual researchers to push the frontiers of science
- Support for the early independence of young researchers
- Industry participation is welcome





ERC offers a new partnership in Europe



 From individual to institutional excellence: committed to scientific excellence while helping dynamic institutions that successfully attract high-level researchers

 Raising standards throughout Europe: ERC acts as a catalyst for reforms in research funding policies in Europe






No distinction made between basic research and basic technology



- "Frontier research" responds to the blurring boundaries between basic and applied research
- "Frontier technology" emerges often in the course of basic research
- If picked up, frontier technologies travel well: across research fields and out of the lab












ERC budget increases by € 250 M€ / year

The ERC keeps its strategy simple, flexible and focused!

- "Starting Grant": Support young(*) researchers (*) 2-10 yrs post-PhD
- "Advanced Grant": Support leading(*) scientists (*) in past 10 yrs
- Promote excellence irrespective of nationality, age, or field
- Trust the dynamic of science
 - → The ERC funds the individual PI (and his/her individual team)
 - **→** Grants are portable
- Encourage interdisciplinarity by mainstreaming interdisciplinary projects







The ERC paradigm



researcher

- Frontier research based solely on scientific excellence proposal
- Open competition of outstanding individuals of all nationalities and ages willing to move, stay and do research in Europe
 - (*) minimum 50% time in Europe, 30% time on project Europe = 39 countries of European Research Area (ERA)
- Generous funding for ambitious projects (up to €2 mil / €3.5 mil)
- No quotas per country/region, gender, etc.
- All fields supported: 3 Domains

(Life Sciences, Physical Sciences & Engineering, Social Sciences & Engineering)







Two complementary funding schemes



ERC Starting Grant (StG): attract & retain the next generation of independent research leaders - up to €2.0 Mio for 5 years

- Support researchers at the start of their independent research career and **establishing or consolidating their own independent research team** (or research programme)
- Provide a structure for **transition** from working under a supervisor to an independent research leader

ERC Advanced Grant (AdG): attract & reward established independent research leaders - up to €3.5 Mio for 5 years

- Designed to **support excellent investigator-initiated frontier research projects** by established independent research leaders
- Targeting researchers who have already established their independence as team leaders and are **exceptional leaders in terms of significance of their research achievements** (in the last 10 years)








Submitted proposals by domain

Number of proposals















Submitted proposals from researchers with nationality from a Third country



Share of selected proposals by country of host institution






Success rate by country of host institution


(i.e. ratio submitted – selected proposals)








242 StG 09 proposals




Proposals per billion GDP on R&D*

* Total intramural R&D expenditure (GERD) in billion Euro












Submitted and selected proposals by female applicants






Share of submitted and selected proposals by **Greek nationals and Greek host institutions**








Share of submitted and selected proposals by Greek host institutions

Funding is provided for the implementation of groundbreaking research for a period of 5 years. Two types of Grants are available:

- ERC Starting Grants for young postdocs (3-8 years research experience).
- ERC Advanced Grants for established senior researchers.

 Support in the proposal writing stage: screening and review of proposal in cooperation with external consultants

For successful ERC-candidates:

- A long-term research professorship

WP 2010, structure



- a) Stable and complementary grant schemes: StG, AdG.
 - Investigator driven ("bottom-up") actions.
 - Highest quality research at the frontiers of knowledge with particular encouragement of interdisciplinarity.
 - Evaluation of proposals on the basis of the sole criterion of excellence.
 - Targeting investigators at two different career stages.
 - Multiple, sliding stage opportunities over 7 years of FP7.
 - Continuously increasing budget.
- b) Funding.
 - Calls' cumulative budget surpassing for the first time the €1 bn mark!
 - Complementing Member States' activities towards full spectrum coverage (SP Ideas-consistent).
- c) Accompanying measures/actions (CSA) for the timely monitoring/assessment of the ERC activities.







WP 2010, general adjustments



- 1. Significant budgetary strengthening of StG (StG/AdG ca.1/1). Strategic adjustment.
- 2. Measures to increase attractiveness of EU and associated countries to researchers from third countries. We are not there yet!
- 3. Further addressing of justified research career gaps and/or unconventional research career paths (especially for women researchers). We are not there yet!
- 4. Slight simplification of proposal structure (no self-evaluation). Feedback from applicants/panels.
- 5. Clearer indications of expected commitment to the ERC-funded activity by the PI of a StG and AdG project (previously only specified in the Guide for Applicants). A lot of questions from potential applicants/"granting experience", make expectations clear.

WP 2010, AdG specific adjustments

- No change in content (high quality applications by excellent established Pls).
- Re-application rule (from ERC-2010-AdG and on): every other call unless proposal evaluated over quality threshold at step-2 but not funded. AdG have more chances.
- Re-application rule that links applicants of either ERC-2008-AdG or ERC-2009-AdG calls with the ERC-2010-AdG still holds. Legal obligation.







WP 2010, other elements

a) Complementary actions/activities/studies via CSAs (call for tenders in 2010, expert groups).

b) Support to chair and vice chairs of Scientific Council via CSA.




